

JANUARY ASCON WORK UPDATES

Current work:

- Work to complete the 16-foot barrier wall in the northeast corner of the Site took place this month. Northeast corner excavation work and construction of the barrier wall began on 1/9 and is scheduled to be completed before the end of the month.
- This work includes lane closures and traffic control measures along Hamilton Ave, Magnolia St. and the intersection. The lane closures began on Monday, 1/13, and all lanes are reopened daily upon completion of work.
- The Ascon community resource table in Edison Park and offsite air monitoring personnel are out in the community this month.

Upcoming work:

- Excavation and grading along the northern end of the Site, an area with a higher potential for odor, is planned upon completion of the 16-foot barrier wall. Excavation and grading in this area is expected to continue through most of 2025.
- Excavation and grading at the southeastern corner of the Site is expected to continue through late March 2025, where a future stormwater detention basin will be located.
- During excavation and grading work in areas with a higher potential for odor in 2025, additional air monitoring personnel are observing for odors in the community, and the community resource table will be in Edison Park. DTSC will continue to be onsite observing work. Ascon will continue to note upcoming work in the weekly Site updates.


AIR MONITORING DURING RESTART WORK

During Final Remedy excavation and grading work, monitoring includes:


- 6 onsite perimeter near real-time telemetry air monitoring stations for dust and total VOCs
- 4 offsite trailers monitoring for VOCs, including locations adjacent to Eader Elementary and Edison High School
- Onsite workers monitoring downwind of excavations for odor, total VOCs and H₂S (hydrogen sulfide)
- Dedicated personnel are in the community downwind of areas of excavation monitoring for potential odors
- During excavation in areas with higher potential for odor, additional monitoring personnel will be in the community, and an information table will be set up in Edison Park for community members to ask questions
- Data results will be posted on asconhb.com



Map is for illustrative purposes only. Boundaries and locations shown are approximate.




2025 Ascon Stormwater Site Preparation

Scope of Projects

Bushard Corridor Improvements (Adams to Brookhurst)

- Roundabout installation at the Banning and Bushard intersection
- Limited concrete replacement, tree replacement, striping and signage, pavement slurry coat, and mobility improvements

Newland Corridor Improvements (Adams to Pacific Coast Highway)

- Limited concrete replacement, tree replacement, striping and signage, pavement slurry coat, and mobility improvements

Hamilton Corridor Improvements (Magnolia to Brookhurst)

- Limited concrete replacement, tree replacement, median island installation, striping and signage, pavement rehabilitation, and mobility improvements

Preliminary Schedule

- Design Phase FY24/25
- Construction Phase FY25/26




JANUARY – DECEMBER 2024




- Citywide - Part I Crimes are down 3.6%
