

Scope of Narrative for The Aloha Fair

The Aloha Fair is a once monthly, (1st Sunday) Arts & Crafts Fair touting local Huntington Beach Business's, vendors and non-profit groups. People from all over come to experience a taste of Aloha with arts & craft vendors showcasing their handmade products and business's. Pacific Islander Foundation in conjunction with LAIslandRadio.com, Jeff Josin and David Brown help facilitate this event as well continued fundraising for the Lahaina Maui fire victims.

Churches from Orange County occasionally bless the fair with their Hula. We pipe taped Hawaiian music through our speakers to add to the island spirit.

Hours of operation are the first Sunday of every month, 10 am to 4 pm. Set up is at 8:30am. Vendor breakdown starts at 3:30pm, vendors are gone by 5:00pm. 20 – 30 Vendors depending on weather and availability.

Parking is on either side of the fair. There are 4 parking attendants/event staff to guide visitors. Self parking signs are at both entrances. Cones block off the fair so cars are unable to enter. There are 67 parking spaces in the fair site. There are 102 parking spaces in the lot entering from Beach Blvd and 85 parking spaces in the lot entering from Stark Street. Additional parking is available in the overflow areas.

Regarding the religious cultural hula, the maximum number of dancers is from 1-4. Each dance 2-3 minutes and they perform for a total of 15 minutes. They are blessing the fair. Since these are religious groups that come from their church ministry, their availability is varied. Sometimes there are no dancers at the event and we play Hawaiian music through the speakers via an iPhone.

There is absolutely NO Alcohol allowed on the premises as this is a private property.

This fair is now going on 6 years and is a compliment to the Huntington Beach community at large.
