By design, commemorative plaques showcase the person or entity being commemorated. They need not be wordy.

This design is scant (118 characters to be exact) on lauding the library's wonderful service to the residents, young and old, of Huntington Beach since 1975.

On the other hand, it is quite heavy on mentioning the city council, commission, and exec leadership members (360 characters 3 times the amount for the library – $1/4^{th}$ of the panel) by name and position, and inappropriately shoe-horning an inflammatory partisan connection into the process. The words city council and maga are even in a larger font than the name of the library! Seriously? By the way, I do believe, it is illegal to utilize city revenue for partisan or religious purposes – you may want to check that with the city attorney and treasurer's office. Having said that ...

An appropriate plaque would commemorate 50 years of library service to the community of Huntington Beach, not elevate the council, commission or exec leadership or transitory partisan politics. Nor is it a patriotic endeavor warranting the use of our eagle and flag dominating the top third of the plaque.

I strongly urge you to reject this proposal and stand for the integrity of our public spaces. The library was built for the people—by the people who use it—not for a political slogan.

Public institutions must remain spaces for **learning and connection—not political tools**. Let us honor the library's **true legacy—not distort it**.
