Funding Recommendations for the 2026-27 CDBG Public Services Applications

February 19, 2026

Background

- **The City receives annually approximately \$1.1 million in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding.**
- **15% of the CDBG funding is allocated to public services activities, which the CPAB will make funding recommendations to the City Council.**
- **CDBG public services applications were due to the City by December 11, 2025.**
- **In all, nine (9) public services applications were received.**
- **On January 29, CPAB heard oral presentations from each of the CDBG public services applicants.**

Summary of CDBG Applications

● **CDBG – Estimated 2026-27 Allocation of \$1,100,000**

● **Public Services Applications (maximum \$161,000):**

○ City of HB – Senior Center	\$ 48,000
○ NAMI OC	\$ 40,000
○ Oakview FRC/Children’s Bureau	\$ 85,000
○ Pathways to Independence	\$ 40,000
○ Project Hope Alliance	\$ 50,000
○ Robyne’s Nest	\$ 50,000
○ Save the Brave	\$ 75,000
○ Something More	\$ 45,000
○ StandUp for Kids OC	<u>\$ 26,915</u>
Total Funding Requests:	\$ 459,915

Revised Funding Adjustments

- **In case HUD does not release final allocations by the CPAB Joint Study Session with City Council, alternative funding adjustments could be determined.**
- **Funding levels could be adjusted as follows:**
 - **Funding levels to applicants be increased or reduced by a proportionate share (weighted average) if higher or lower than CDBG allocation from HUD**
 - OR**
 - **Funding levels to applicants be increased or reduced by an equal share if higher or lower than CDBG allocation from HUD**
 - OR**
 - **Funding levels could be increased or reduced for one or more applications.**

Next Steps

- **After the conclusion of tonight's meeting, the CPAB's 2026-27 CDBG public services funding recommendations will be presented at a Joint Study Session with City Council to be held on Tuesday, March 17, 2026.**
- **On May 5, 2026, City Council will consider CPAB final recommendations as may be modified at the Study Session as part of the approval of the 2026-27 Annual Action Plan.**
