1. History and Overview of Fire Department Marine Safety Division

McDonald, Peters and Simon presented an overview of the history and operations of the Marine Safety Division. The PowerPoint presentation (attached) was also provided as a handout to Commissioners.

1. Harbour Commission Designation of Ad Hoc Committees

Commissioners decided upon the following Ad Hoc Committees, with these members:

- 1) Water Quality (Nielsen, Schauppner, Wood) This committee will look at water quality issues and initiatives
- 2) Infrastructure (Larkin, Williams, Vu) This committee will look at Harbour infrastructure, including bridge repair, lift stations, bulkheads and related financing issues
- Vessels and Watercraft (Milligan, Williams, Vu) This committee will develop recommendations related to enhanced code enforcement, compliance with existing laws and increased safety

Each ad hoc committee will have a term of six (6) months.

West introduced Villa, who will be taking his place in February 2026. Justen said that he inquired of the Police Department about a tour of their new crime center, which the Commission requested. They said that it will not be operational for several months but offered a combination tour of the new communications center and crime center. Commissioners expressed interest and Justen will be setting up two (2) tours. He also reported that Captain O'Brien, Commander of Naval Weapons Station Seal Beach, said that she was honored and grateful that the Commission recommended her for the Mayor's Spotlight Award but, unfortunately, she had to report for her new duty assignment in San Diego on July 18th and the Award ceremony was July 22nd, so she could not attend to receive the award.

MEMBER COMMENTS

Milligan reported that she attended the change of command ceremony at Naval Weapons Station Seal Beach, along with Schauppner and Burns. Schauppner said that the new Commander, Captain Caldwell, is very impressive and worked his way up through Navy ranks. Wood said that she is excited about the City Council multitrophic aquaculture initiative. Nielsen, Wood and Williams complimented Marine Safety staff on their presentation. Williams also welcomed Villa and said that he looks forward to working with him.

1904 - 1917:


• City was required by state law to place a dory on the beach.

1918:

 First lifeguards assigned to the city's beachfront.

1931:

• City hires first full-time lifeguards.



Marine Safety Begins

1932-1938:

- Wrote training and general orders manuals.
- Incorporated radio and telephone systems.
- Used four-wheel drive pickups trucks and paddleboards (replacing dories).
- Created perimeter defense concept; towers located along the beachfront in strategic positions.




1939: "Bud" Higgins and Don Winters

Population Explosion

1958-1966:

- Permanent lifeguard staff increase from 2 to 13; seasonal staff from 32 to 72.
- Lifeguards deputized, employment standards upgraded, public relations programs improved.
- County's first underwater rescue team incorporated.
- Helicopters used for observation of critical surf areas.
- In 1962 the first Lifeguard Training Class was established.





Public Safety Team - EMS System








Capabilities and Response Types - Swiftwater (Water Entry)





Tower Stations




