I am writing to express my strong support for the proposed Bolsa Chica Senior Living Community at 4952 and 4972 Warner Avenue. As a commercial real estate broker with experience in site acquisitions and approvals for 18 senior living projects, I have seen firsthand the many benefits that these communities offer to both their residents and the surrounding community.

The growing unmet demand for senior living and minimal impact on traffic generation without burdening local schools are well documented in the various materials supporting Hines' development application. Assisted Living units in most cases meet the Census Definition of a Housing Unit, which is the criterion to qualify for inclusion in the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) count.
