PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF HUNTINGTON BEACH AND IDS GROUP, INC.

FOR

ON-CALL ARCHITECTURAL ENGINEERING, LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURAL ENGINEERING AND PROFESSIONAL CONSULTING SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the City of Huntington Beach, a municipal corporation of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," and IDS GROUP, INC., a California Corporation hereinafter referred to as "CONSULTANT."

WHEREAS, CITY desires to engage the services of a consultant to provide on-call architectural engineering, landscape architectural engineering and professional consulting services; and

Pursuant to documentation on file in the office of the City Clerk, the provisions of the Huntington Beach Municipal Code, Chapter 3.03, relating to procurement of professional service contracts have been complied with; and

CONSULTANT has been selected to perform these services,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by CITY and CONSULTANT as follows:

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

CONSULTANT shall provide all services as described in **Exhibit** "A," which is attached hereto and incorporated into this Agreement by this reference. These services shall sometimes hereinafter be referred to as the "PROJECT."

CONSULTANT hereby designates Kristen Gros who shall represent it and be its sole contact and agent in all consultations with CITY during the performance of this Agreement.

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2. CITY STAFF ASSISTANCE

CITY shall assign a staff coordinator to work directly with CONSULTANT in the performance of this Agreement.

3. TERM; TIME OF PERFORMANCE

Time is of the essence of this Agreement. The services of CONSULTANT are to commence on ________, 20_____ (the "Commencement Date"). This Agreement shall automatically terminate three (3) years from the Commencement Date, unless extended or sooner terminated as provided herein. All tasks specified in **Exhibit "A"** shall be completed no later than three (3) years from the Commencement Date. The time for performance of the tasks identified in **Exhibit "A"** are generally to be shown in **Exhibit "A."** This schedule may be amended to benefit the PROJECT if mutually agreed to in writing by CITY and CONSULTANT.

In the event the Commencement Date precedes the Effective Date, CONSULTANT shall be bound by all terms and conditions as provided herein.

4. COMPENSATION

In consideration of the performance of the services described herein, CITY agrees to pay CONSULTANT on a time and materials basis at the rates specified in **Exhibit "B,"** which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference into this Agreement, a fee, including all costs and expenses, not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

5. <u>EXTRA WORK</u>

In the event CITY requires additional services not included in **Exhibit "A"** or changes in the scope of services described in **Exhibit "A,"** CONSULTANT will undertake such work only after receiving written authorization from CITY. Additional compensation for such extra work shall be allowed only if the prior written approval of CITY is obtained.

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6. <u>METHOD OF PAYMENT</u>

CONSULTANT shall be paid pursuant to the terms of Exhibit "B."

7. <u>DISPOSITION OF PLANS, ESTIMATES AND OTHER DOCUMENTS</u>

CONSULTANT agrees that title to all materials prepared hereunder, including, without limitation, all original drawings, designs, reports, both field and office notices, calculations, computer code, language, data or programs, maps, memoranda, letters and other documents, shall belong to CITY, and CONSULTANT shall turn these materials over to CITY upon expiration or termination of this Agreement or upon PROJECT completion, whichever shall occur first. These materials may be used by CITY as it sees fit, provided that any such use not within the purposes intended, by the Agreement shall be at City's sole risk.

8. HOLD HARMLESS

A. To the extent allowed by Civil Code Section 2782.8, CONSULTANT hereby agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless CITY, its officers, elected or appointed officials, employees, agents and volunteers from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, expenses, judgments, demands and defense costs (including, without limitation, costs and fees of litigation of every nature or liability of any kind or nature) arising out of or in connection with CONSULTANT's (or CONSULTANT's subcontractors, if any) negligent (or alleged negligent) performance of this Agreement or its failure to comply with any of its obligations contained in this Agreement by CONSULTANT, its officers, agents or employees except such loss or damage which was caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of CITY. CONSULTANT will conduct all defense at its sole cost and expense and CITY shall approve selection of CONSULTANT's counsel. This indemnity shall apply to all claims and liability regardless of whether any insurance policies are applicable. The policy limits do not act as limitation upon the amount of indemnification to be provided by CONSULTANT.

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B. To the extent that CONSULTANT performs "Design Professional Services" within the meaning of Civil Code Section 2782.8, then the following Hold Harmless provision applies in place of subsection A above:

"CONSULTANT hereby agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless CITY and its officers, elected or appointed officials, employees, agents and volunteers, from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, expenses, demands and defense costs (including, without limitation, costs and fees of litigation of every nature or liability of any kind or nature) to the extent that the claims against CONSULTANT arise out of, pertain to, or relate to the negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct of CONSULTANT. In no event shall the cost to defend charged to CONSULTANT exceed CONSULTANT's proportionate percentage of fault. However, notwithstanding the previous sentence, in the event one or more other defendants to the claims and/or litigation is unable to pay its share of defense costs due to bankruptcy or dissolution of the business, CONSULTANT shall meet and confer with CITY and other defendants regarding unpaid defense costs. The duty to indemnify, including the duty and the cost to defend, is limited as provided in California Civil Code Section 2782.8.

C. Regardless of whether subparagraph A or B applies, CITY shall be reimbursed by CONSULTANT for all costs and attorney's fees incurred by CITY in enforcing this obligation. This indemnity shall apply to all claims and liability regardless of whether any insurance policies are applicable. The policy limits do not act as a limitation upon the amount of indemnification to be provided by CONSULTANT.

9. PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

CONSULTANT shall obtain and furnish to CITY a professional liability insurance policy covering the work performed by it hereunder. This policy shall provide coverage for CONSULTANT's professional liability in an amount not less than One Million Dollars

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(\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and in the aggregate. The above-mentioned insurance shall not contain a self-insured retention without the express written consent of CITY; however an insurance policy "deductible" of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or less is permitted. A claims-made policy shall be acceptable if the policy further provides that:

- A. The policy retroactive date coincides with or precedes the initiation of the scope of work (including subsequent policies purchased as renewals or replacements).
- B. CONSULTANT shall notify CITY of circumstances or incidents that might give rise to future claims.

CONSULTANT will make every effort to maintain similar insurance during the required extended period of coverage following PROJECT completion. If insurance is terminated for any reason, CONSULTANT agrees to purchase an extended reporting provision of at least two (2) years to report claims arising from work performed in connection with this Agreement.

If CONSULTANT fails or refuses to produce or maintain the insurance required by this section or fails or refuses to furnish the CITY with required proof that insurance has been procured and is in force and paid for, the CITY shall have the right, at the CITY's election, to forthwith terminate this Agreement. Such termination shall not effect Consultant's right to be paid for its time and materials expended prior to notification of termination. CONSULTANT waives the right to receive compensation and agrees to indemnify the CITY for any work performed prior to approval of insurance by the CITY.

10. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

Prior to commencing performance of the work hereunder, CONSULTANT shall furnish to CITY a certificate of insurance subject to approval of the City Attorney evidencing the foregoing insurance coverage as required by this Agreement; the certificate shall:

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- A. provide the name and policy number of each carrier and policy;
- B. state that the policy is currently in force; and
- C. shall promise that such policy shall not be suspended, voided or canceled by either party, reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice; however, ten (10) days' prior written notice in the event of cancellation for nonpayment of premium.

CONSULTANT shall maintain the foregoing insurance coverage in force until the work under this Agreement is fully completed and accepted by CITY.

The requirement for carrying the foregoing insurance coverage shall not derogate from CONSULTANT's defense, hold harmless and indemnification obligations as set forth in this Agreement. CITY or its representative shall at all times have the right to demand the original or a copy of the policy of insurance. CONSULTANT shall pay, in a prompt and timely manner, the premiums on the insurance hereinabove required.

11. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

CONSULTANT is, and shall be, acting at all times in the performance of this Agreement as an independent contractor herein and not as an employee of CITY. CONSULTANT shall secure at its own cost and expense, and be responsible for any and all payment of all taxes, social security, state disability insurance compensation, unemployment compensation and other payroll deductions for CONSULTANT and its officers, agents and employees and all business licenses, if any, in connection with the PROJECT and/or the services to be performed hereunder.

12. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

All work required hereunder shall be performed in a good and workmanlike manner.

CITY may terminate CONSULTANT's services hereunder at any time with or without cause, and whether or not the PROJECT is fully complete. Any termination of this Agreement by CITY shall

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be made in writing, notice of which shall be delivered to CONSULTANT as provided herein. In the event of termination, all finished and unfinished documents, exhibits, report, and evidence shall, at the option of CITY, become its property and shall be promptly delivered to it by CONSULTANT.

13. ASSIGNMENT AND DELEGATION

This Agreement is a personal service contract and the work hereunder shall not be assigned, delegated or subcontracted by CONSULTANT to any other person or entity without the prior express written consent of CITY. If an assignment, delegation or subcontract is approved, all approved assignees, delegates and subconsultants must satisfy the insurance requirements as set forth in Sections 9 and 10 hereinabove.

14. COPYRIGHTS/PATENTS

CITY shall own all rights to any patent or copyright on any work, item or material produced as a result of this Agreement.

15. CITY EMPLOYEES AND OFFICIALS

CONSULTANT shall employ no CITY official nor any regular CITY employee in the work performed pursuant to this Agreement. No officer or employee of CITY shall have any financial interest in this Agreement in violation of the applicable provisions of the California Government Code.

16. NOTICES

Any notices, certificates, or other communications hereunder shall be given either by personal delivery to CONSULTANT's agent (as designated in Section 1 hereinabove) or to CITY as the situation shall warrant, or by enclosing the same in a sealed envelope, postage prepaid, and depositing the same in the United States Postal Service, to the addresses specified below. CITY and CONSULTANT may designate different addresses to which subsequent notices, certificates or

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other communications will be sent by notifying the other party via personal delivery, a reputable

overnight carrier or U. S. certified mail-return receipt requested:

17. CONSENT

When CITY's consent/approval is required under this Agreement, its

consent/approval for one transaction or event shall not be deemed to be a consent/approval to any

subsequent occurrence of the same or any other transaction or event.

18. MODIFICATION

No waiver or modification of any language in this Agreement shall be valid unless in

writing and duly executed by both parties.

19. SECTION HEADINGS

The titles, captions, section, paragraph and subject headings, and descriptive phrases

at the beginning of the various sections in this Agreement are merely descriptive and are included

solely for convenience of reference only and are not representative of matters included or excluded

from such provisions, and do not interpret, define, limit or describe, or construe the intent of the

parties or affect the construction or interpretation of any provision of this Agreement.

20. INTERPRETATION OF THIS AGREEMENT

The language of all parts of this Agreement shall in all cases be construed as a

whole, according to its fair meaning, and not strictly for or against any of the parties. If any

provision of this Agreement is held by an arbitrator or court of competent jurisdiction to be

unenforceable, void, illegal or invalid, such holding shall not invalidate or affect the remaining

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covenants and provisions of this Agreement. No covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other unless so expressly provided here. As used in this Agreement, the masculine or neuter gender and singular or plural number shall be deemed to include the other whenever the context so indicates or requires. Nothing contained herein shall be construed so as to require the commission of any act contrary to law, and wherever there is any conflict between any provision contained herein and any present or future statute, law, ordinance or regulation contrary to which the parties have no right to contract, then the latter shall prevail, and the provision of this Agreement which is hereby affected shall be curtailed and limited only to the extent necessary to bring it within the requirements of the law.

21. <u>DUPLICATE ORIGINAL</u>

The original of this Agreement and one or more copies hereto have been prepared and signed in counterparts as duplicate originals, each of which so executed shall, irrespective of the date of its execution and delivery, be deemed an original. Each duplicate original shall be deemed an original instrument as against any party who has signed it.

22. <u>IMMIGRATION</u>

CONSULTANT shall be responsible for full compliance with the immigration and naturalization laws of the United States and shall, in particular, comply with the provisions of the United States Code regarding employment verification.

23. LEGAL SERVICES SUBCONTRACTING PROHIBITED

CONSULTANT and CITY agree that CITY is not liable for payment of any subcontractor work involving legal services, and that such legal services are expressly outside the scope of services contemplated hereunder. CONSULTANT understands that pursuant to *Huntington Beach City Charter* Section 309, the City Attorney is the exclusive legal counsel for

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CITY; and CITY shall not be liable for payment of any legal services expenses incurred by CONSULTANT.

24. ATTORNEY'S FEES

In the event suit is brought by either party to construe, interpret and/or enforce the terms and/or provisions of this Agreement or to secure the performance hereof, each party shall bear its own attorney's fees, such that the prevailing party shall not be entitled to recover its attorney's fees from the nonprevailing party.

25. SURVIVAL

Terms and conditions of this Agreement, which by their sense and context survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, shall so survive.

26. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

27. <u>SIGNATORIES</u>

Each undersigned represents and warrants that its signature hereinbelow has the power, authority and right to bind their respective parties to each of the terms of this Agreement, and shall indemnify CITY fully for any injuries or damages to CITY in the event that such authority or power is not, in fact, held by the signatory or is withdrawn.

28. ENTIRETY

The parties acknowledge and agree that they are entering into this Agreement freely and voluntarily following extensive arm's length negotiation, and that each has had the opportunity to consult with legal counsel prior to executing this Agreement. The parties also acknowledge and agree that no representations, inducements, promises, agreements or warranties, oral or otherwise, have been made by that party or anyone acting on that party's behalf, which are not embodied in this

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Agreement, and that that party has not executed this Agreement in reliance on any representation, inducement, promise, agreement, warranty, fact or circumstance not expressly set forth in this Agreement. This Agreement, and the attached exhibits, contain the entire agreement between the parties respecting the subject matter of this Agreement, and supersede all prior understandings and agreements whether oral or in writing between the parties respecting the subject matter hereof.

29. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>

This Agreement shall be effective on the date of its approval by the City Council.

This Agreement shall expire when terminated as provided herein.





Design Development (DD):

Continued development of the Project's characteristics and elements, specific systems to be used, size and quantity of equipment and materials to be used, supporting engineering calculations and confirmation of preliminary concepts.

- Upon approvals obtained by the City during the preceding phase, IDS shall prepare the Design Development package, develop and refine the details of all aspects of the design.
- Include cost estimate and specifications.
- Civil and site to be described thoroughly as needed for the project.
- Architectural elements such as walls, doors, windows, columns, ceilings and floors.
- Engineering systems such as structural, mechanical,
 plumbing and electrical systems.

- Lighting systems and layouts (as appropriate).
- Fire protection systems as needed.
- Millwork development including the details for all items such as architectural trim, storage units, custom furnishings and casework. (if/where required)
- Finish Selection and Specification Architect shall prepare loose sample options for review and discussion. Upon approval, we shall prepare color and material sample boards for presentations.
- Prepare and distribute design review meeting minutes.

Construction Documents

Construction Documents (CD):

- Detailed design and construction drawings and specifications necessary for construction entities to construct the project when applicable.
- Upon approval by the City, prepare Construction Document package including any revisions required from the Design Development review.
- Include Final Construction cost estimates.
- Include CSI specifications.
- Submit Construction Documents (CD) at: (1) the 50% design stage, (2) 90% submittal to Building and Safety, and (3) 100% submittal of the final project bid set.
- **For smaller refurbishment projects, final submittals for the Construction Document phase will consist of plans and specifications. CDs must be complete in order to obtain permits and allow a contractor to establish a maximum construction price for the work.
- Submit 90% CD to agencies for plan check.
- Make plan check corrections and resubmit for final permit.
- Provide electronic files to the City for bidding and documents as necessary during bidding period.



Coordination with Jurisdictional Approval Agencies:

The Project Architect or Project Manager will meet with the required agencies to address any questions or amendments to the documents for agency approvals.

- Meet with agencies as required: IDS' PM shall submit the approved construction documents to the appropriate governmental agencies for plan check and all applicable permits.
- Address revisions if applicable. IDS shall implement all plan check corrections and resubmit as required for final agency approval.
- Refurbishment projects in City owned sites shall be designed in accordance with Los Angeles County Building codes.
- Work undertaken in other jurisdictions shall be cleared through the appropriate governing agencies.

Support Services During Construction (CA):

- Prepare record drawings from red-lines, provided by the contractor and specifications for the City's records.
- Provide services to help resolve deficiency issues during the warranty period.
- The City will provide the General Conditions for the Contractors.
- The A/E is to provide specifications for all other sections, including temporary facilities, if necessary.

Bidding Stage

- Bid Review: Assist in bid review and award, following bid advertisement and acceptance.
- Pre-Bid Meeting: We will attend the pre-bid meeting.
- RFI Response: Promptly respond to all Requests for Information during the bidding process and assist in Issuing Amendments if needed.

All construction cost estimate updates shall highlight changes made since the submission the last construction cost estimate update. Cost reduction strategies will be reviewed, discussed with the City and implemented.

Our standard software, PlanSwift, provides the flexibility to quickly break out the itemized takeoff. This efficiency reduces the number of resources required to complete the takeoff for each project, and the program's area and zone functions allow the estimator to sort the takeoff into multiple breakouts with minimal efforts.


As design progresses, the more-detailed documents can be virtually overlaid over previous ones, and changes/additions are immediately visible on screen. This ensures that our estimates at logical milestones during design (SD, DD, CD, etc.), can execute the later levels of design faster and more accurately.

- Preliminary Cost Estimate Upon receipt of the conceptual design information, the Cost Estimator begins the
 translation of the conceptual design information into an itemized cost estimate that includes a Project Summary and Detail Report. The Detail Report provides an itemized quantity, labor, materials and equipment breakdown based on CSI or other specified format. The accuracy of the cost estimate is linked to the quality and
 completeness of the submitted design information.
- Preliminary Cost Estimate Review After the preliminary cost estimate is completed, an internal quality meeting is conducted between IDS and the project sub-consultants to review the cost estimate and the proposed design.
- If required, alternative solutions are explored and cost control comparisons are implemented. Requirements of these findings are incorporated into the final engineering process.
- Additionally, the conceptual design is reviewed to identify any special governmental agency code requirements and for compliance with the typical building codes.
- A team meeting with the client is subsequently conducted to review the design and cost estimates. At this time, any necessary adjustments and revisions can be made in the program or design scope to accommodate budget and scheduling expectations.
- Design Development Cost Estimates Typically additional cost estimates are provided at 100% Design Development.
- Construction Documents Cost Estimates Typically cost estimates are provided at 50%, and 90% or 100% Construction Documents.

IDS Group will ensure that each estimate is completed in sufficient detail to represent the level of design. All assumptions are clearly indicated and presented in the format appropriate to their use as cost tracking tools. We utilize a detailed summary of material take-offs and estimates that relate specifically to anticipate the level of work identified in each phase. As the design documents are developed, quantities are entered into a program with unit costs to illustrate the development and changes in the budget. Cost variations can then be tracked and used to help balance the budget and identify areas of high concern.

Bill Barber Park Shade Structure: Colonel Bill Barber Marine Corps Memorial Community Park (Bill Barber Community Park) is a 48-acre sports park located at 4 Civic Center Plaza and offers an array of programs and events for the Irvine community including lighted, state-of-the-art baseball, softball, and soccer fields. 





Brief Description

IDS is working with the City of Downy to provide the design services for the replacement of the entire southerly parking lot, stabilize the subgrade and install new curbs, gutters, and pavement. The design work encompasses the enhancement of pedestrian amenities, addressing damaged sidewalks, walkways, and access ramps. IDS is introducing new decomposed granite trails and walkways, accompanied by concrete curbs throughout the park perimeter, connecting all park amenities to the San Gabriel River regional bike path.



- 1. All billing shall be done <u>monthly</u> in fifteen (15) minute increments and matched to an appropriate breakdown of the time that was taken to perform that work and who performed it.
- 2. Each month's bill should include a total to date. That total should provide, at a glance, the total fees and costs incurred to date for the project.
- 3. A copy of memoranda, letters, reports, calculations and other documentation prepared by CONSULTANT may be required to be submitted to CITY to demonstrate progress toward completion of tasks. In the event CITY rejects or has comments on any such product, CITY shall identify specific requirements for satisfactory completion.
- 4. CONSULTANT shall submit to CITY an invoice for each monthly payment due. Such invoice shall:
 - A) Reference this Agreement;
 - B) Describe the services performed;
 - C) Show the total amount of the payment due;
 - D) Include a certification by a principal member of CONSULTANT's firm that the work has been performed in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement; and
 - E) For all payments include an estimate of the percentage of work completed.

Upon submission of any such invoice, if CITY is satisfied that CONSULTANT is making satisfactory progress toward completion of tasks in accordance with this Agreement, CITY shall approve the invoice, in which event payment shall be made within thirty (30) days of receipt of the invoice by CITY. Such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. If CITY does not approve an invoice, CITY shall notify CONSULTANT in writing of the reasons for non-approval and the schedule of performance set forth in **Exhibit "A"** may at the option of CITY be suspended until the parties agree that past performance by CONSULTANT is in, or has been brought into compliance, or until this Agreement has expired or is terminated as provided herein.

5. Any billings for extra work or additional services authorized in advance and in writing by CITY shall be invoiced separately to CITY. Such invoice shall contain all of the information required above, and in addition shall list the hours expended and hourly rate charged for such time. Such invoices shall be approved by CITY if the work performed is in accordance with the extra work or additional services requested, and if CITY is satisfied that the statement of hours worked and costs incurred is accurate. Such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. Any dispute between the parties concerning payment of such an invoice shall be treated as separate and apart from the ongoing performance of the remainder of this Agreement.

6. Transfer Of Rights Of Recovery Against Others To Us

We walve any right of recovery we may have against any person or organization to the extent required of you by a written contract signed and executed prior to any "accident" or "loss", provided that the "accident" or "loss" arises out of operations contemplated by

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such contract. The walver applies only to the person or organization designated in such contract.

N. UNINTENTIONAL ERRORS OR OMISSIONS

The following is added to Paragraph B.2., Concealment, Misrepresentation, Or Fraud, of SECTION IV -- BUSINESS AUTO CONDITIONS:

The unintentional emission of, or unintentional error in, any information given by you shall not prejudice your rights under this insurance. However this provision does not affect our right to collect additional premium or exercise our right of cancellation or non-renewal.
