

Raptor Perch Poles

- Built and installed 2 Raptor Perch Poles
- Located in the Raptor Foraging Habitat in Huntington Central Park West, between the Urban Forest and Dog Park.
- The Raptor Foraging Habitat was established as a 7.5-acre sanctuary, allowing birds of prey to search for food in a natural habitat.
- The addition of the 2 perch poles provides additional vantage points well above the ground level for foraging.
