For example, you cancelled that ability to comment at city council meetings by Zoom, you have repeatedly and arbitrarily reduced speaking time from three minutes to two or even one minute, and now you've chosen to prevent citizens from entering their intention to speak in advance, either by email or in person. All actions that reduce public input and engagement.

Similarly, you spent an additional \$300,000 of our tax dollars to ensure that your charter amendments wound up on the primary ballot, rather than the general election ballot.
