





Current Cases in Huntington Beach: 348


Population: 203,761

 - · Includes patients and nursing facility staff
 - HB skilled nursing facilities numbers rose early
 - Other OC facilities also reporting increased cases



Adapted and maintained the majority of City services remotely since COVID-19 began

 New portal for electronic plan and document submittals extremely popular in Community Development

Developing City Facility Reopening and Employee Safety Plans

- Centralizing customer-focused services on first floor of City Hall for new concierge service
- Social distancing plans with enhanced cleaning / sanitization
- · Tentative City Hall reopening date of Monday, June 15

Beach Reopening Plan Update

- · 100% of beach parking now open
- · Huntington Beach Pier reopened
- Huntington Harbor beaches (except for Seabridge) available for active use
- City in discussions w/ State regarding shift to passive use at the beach

Library Services

HOLDS PICKUP

How it works



1. Place items on hold.

Go to hbpl.org or call the reference librarian at (714) 842-4481 to place a hold on your items.



2. Wait for confirmation.

We will send you an email, text, or phone message that says your items are ready to pick up.



3. Park at the library and text us.

When you arrive at the library, park in the lot & text "HERE" to (714) 880-7040 to check in.



4. Walk up to tables to pick up items.

We will leave your items on the tables in front of the main entrance for you to pick up.

Junior Guards Program Assessment


- 2020 Junior Lifeguard program modified for participant and teaching staff (City Lifeguards) safety due to COVID-19
- Our plan has been to move to an online video-based curriculum for all returning Junior Lifeguard participants
- These plans were developed in coordination with other area junior lifeguard programs run by Newport Beach and the State
 - We were made aware today that some agencies may be reevaluating the cancellation of their programs, and are looking at other alternative models
 - Here in HB, we will continue to monitor what other agencies are doing, and will certainly propose adjustments if there is a shift in programming approach

SITUATIONAL UPDATE OPENING UP THE CALIFORNIA ECONOMY

Orange County in Full Phase Stage 2 Reopening of California

As of May 23, the following Stage 2 workplaces may reopen in OC, with modifications:

- Dine-in restaurants (bars and gaming areas are not permitted)
- · Destination retail, including shopping malls and swap meets
- In-store retail
- Supply chains for the businesses now operating, in manufacturing, logistics and warehousing
- Select personal care services, including hair salons, barber shops, car washes, pet grooming, and landscape gardening
- Office-based businesses (telework is still strongly encouraged)
- · Outdoor museums, open gallery spaces, and other public spaces
- Childcare
- Schools with modifications
- · All Stage I essential workplaces

ECONOMIC RECOVERY UPDATE HUNTINGTON BEACH ECONOMIC RECOVERY TASK FORCE

- Nine member Task Force comprised of local business leaders from various industries
- Working group meetings held on May 20
- Second full Task Force meeting held on May 29
- Preliminary Recommendations:

Business Retention / Reopening

- Centralize accurate information regarding business rules
- Identify funding for businesses to procure PPE / modify layouts
- Work with Orange County to procure additional funding options for businesses, including through the CARES Act
- Relax permitting processes to facilitate and enhance reopening, including those for live entertainment permits, parking standards, and signage regulations

Communications and Marketing

- Develop a unified marketing message, including themes on cleanliness, peace of mind, "welcome home," and emphasize Huntington Beach's unique coastal and related amenities
- Position Huntington Beach as a leader in OC's economic recovery
- Emphasize safe practices through our marketing messages

Community Economic Development

- Develop expert panels as resources for businesses in coordination with the HB Chamber of Commerce
- Hold virtual "town hall" meetings on issues related to economic recovery
- Conduct targeted outreach to manufacturing businesses

ECONOMIC RECOVERY UPDATE PLANNING EFFORTS UNDERWAY

Supporting Immediate and Long-Term Economic Recovery

- Launch of HBReady Reopen website, with the most up-todate guidelines by industry - hbready.com/reopen
- New "Welcome Back to SurfCity USA" social media campaign to promote local businesses with Visit Huntington Beach
- Develop a "Grow HB" loan program administered by the National Development Council
- Potential pilot programs with ride-hailing app / shuttle to improve downtown transportation
- Industry cluster / workforce analysis, and retail analysis





ECONOMIC RECOVERY UPDATE PLANNING EFFORTS UNDERWAY

Supporting Immediate and Long-Term Economic Recovery

- CARES Act Funding for Small Businesses
 - Supervisor Steel allocated \$15 million directly to cities in OC's 2nd District to disburse
 - Huntington Beach has received <u>~\$4.75 million</u> in CARES Act funding to support local small businesses
 - Staff is currently developing grant program guidelines for eligible participants, which include:
 - Independently owned and operated business that is not dominant in its field of operation
 - · Principal offices located within the Huntington Beach
 - Together with affiliates, has 100 or fewer employees
 - Average annual gross receipts of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000) or less over the previous three years
 - A manufacturer with 100 or fewer employees
 - Plan to bring program proposal to City Council on June 15

Supporting Immediate and Long-Term Economic Recovery

Virtual Town Hall Meetings

- First meeting held May 29
- Discussed resources for small businesses, including the Paycheck Protection Program for those impacted by COVID-19
- Approx. 40 participants

OneHB Micro-grant Program

- New grant program of \$5,000 each to local small businesses in HB
- Memorandum of Understanding with Chamber of Commerce, CIELO, Small Business Development Center under Council consideration this evening
