



Details:

On 09-15-94 at 1944 hours, I received a call of a gunshot victim at McDonald's Restaurant at the intersection of Memphis and Beach. I responded from the north end of the city.

As I arrived at the location I was detailed by Sergeant DEUEL to respond victim FLOURNOY to Pacifica Hospital to see if I could obtain a dying ded tion from him.

I responded to Pacifica Hospital, arriving at approximately 2003 hours. walked into the Emergency Room and to an adjoining room to the rear of th Emergency Room, I heard the attending physician, Doctor NAGY. She stated thing to the effect of call code. She then said that the victim's heart

ty. All of the attending personnel in the Emergency Room then stopped their k on victim FLOURNOY. They called the time of death at 2003 hours.

At 2005 hours, the coroner was notified. I spoke with a Deputy Coroner KING, of the Orange County Coroner's Office, who said he was sending out Deputy Coroner MCANALLY. He also told me that their case number would be 94-5758MA.

Later in the evening, Detective RUSSELL arrived and took charge of the victim and assisted MCANALLY with his investigation.

I responded back to the scene where I assisted in traffic control until I was relieved at approximately 2340 hours.

I spoke with paramedics SMITH and DALTON of the Huntington Beach Fire Department, who are stationed at Lake Fire Station. They told me they attended to the victim at the scene and went with him in the ambulance to Pacifica Hospital. They said he never regained consciousness or said anything to them.

Officer responded to hospital in an attempt to obtain any statement from Mr. Flournoy. The time of death was 8:03 pm

- Witness Hart and his son were monitoring his police scanner and heard the suspect's description. His son immediately recognized him as "Rusty" because of the **tattoo on the back of his neck.**
- About 6 months prior the shooting, Rusty and two other skinheads became involved in a fight at the corner of Main and PCH with Witness Hart's youngest son and the older sibling was there and struck Rusty on his head with a can of soda.
- At that time Rusty and his skinhead friends were known to belong to a gang called, "Irish Brotherhood."
- Hart said Rusty lived in the Seabridge Condo Complex. This is where Witness Apocada saw the suspects run to.
- Rusty's real name is not known at this time

At the same time Officer Tidrick recalls the Field Interview Card

(About a month before the murder) - 08/20/1994 at 10pm in the down town area Officer Tidrick recognizes Johnathan "Rusty" Kennedy from prior contacts and notices a new tattoo in the back of his neck. He documented the new Tattoo in a Field Interview Card.

They detained 3 subjects:

- 1. Jeffrey Allen Franz (19 yrs).....Arrested for Misdemeanor Warrant (Wearing Black boots with red shoe laces)
- 2. Robert Dylan Wofford (17yrs)
- 3. Erin Rodney Chapman (18yrs)......Agreed to drive to the police station on their on accord to talk to detectives in regards to this incident.



The skinhead subculture emerged in Great Britain in the 1970s, its adherents developed shared styles of clothing, including wearing steel-toed work boots made by Doc Martens or other manufacturers. The boots themselves became weapons used to kick people in fights, leading to the term "boot party," which refers to incidents in which multiple skinheads together stomp and kick a victim.

Wearing such boots was and is typical of racist and non-racist skinheads alike, but racist skinheads commonly use red- or white-colored shoelaces in their boots to identify themselves as white power skinheads.

Within a few racist skinhead circles, white or red laces have to be "earned" by some violent act such as attacking a perceived enemy of the white race.



I told him that he would be handcuffed just long enough for me to obtain enough information to exclude him as a suspect. It was approximately 2200 hours at this time.

The subject identified himself as the last name of KENNEDY, first of Johnathan, middle of Russell, with a DOB of 07-11-75. He told me he lives at 303 19th Street, apartment A, and has a phone number of 840-5727. Subject KENNEDY told me that he was 5'06" tall and weighed approximately 160 pounds.

I radioed Sergeant TIDRICK and advised him of the circumstances and he told me that a detective would be en route.

I asked KENNEDY where he had been this evening, and he told me that he and his friend, JAMES, Don, a male white, who he thought was around 18 years old, and

DETAILS

On September 15, 1994 at approximately 7:35 pm, two male suresting to the walking northbound on the east side of Beach Blvd., having just left the McDonald's restaurant at 20362 Beach Blvd. Approximately 100' north of the restaurant they came into contact with a black male who was walking southbound on Beach, also on the east side. Witnesses state they heard some kind of verbal exchange between the subjects that soon escalated into a physical altercation between all three individuals. At some point one of the suspects pulled out a small caliber handgun and shot the victim. Both suspects then ran away from the scene continuing north on Beach Blvd. The victim stumbled into McDonalds where employees and customers began first aid and called 911. Paramedics responded, transported the victim to Pacifica Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

9/16/1994 @ 1am

At this time the name of the victim is not being released pending the notification of next of kin.

It is unknown exactly what type of handgun was used, and there is no apparent motive.

SUSPECT DESCRIPTION

OUSPECT #1: A white male; 17-20; 6'1"; 185; stocky build; wearing a dark blue or black beanie pulled down low over his face, no shirt, and a dark blue colored light jacket.

SUSPECT #2: A white male; 17-20; 5'10"; 165; medium build; wearing a white T-shirt, threequarters length baggy shorts, possibly green in color.

Investigation continues and a police artist is currently attempting to draw a composite of at least one suspect from witness description.

Wofford's First Interview (9/16/@ 1205 am)

Denied knowing Rusty, denied being at the McDonalds, denied knowing anything about the shooting.



Chapman's Interview (9/16 @ 1205 am)

- Admits to drinking at 8411 Waterspray with Franz, Wofford. He denied knowing Rusty until detectives told him they were seen together at the Seven Eleven and at the Condo's racquet ball court.
- After "Much" conversation Chapman admits that after the police stopped them (Franz, Chapman, and Wofford), Wofford told him Rusty shot some black guy one at the Mc Donalds. They ran to 8411 Waterspray, changed clothes, and Rusty disappeared.

Franz' Interview (9/16@1am)

• Under arrest for misdemeanor warrant. Admits knowing Rusty and drinking at 8411 Waterspray (Seabridge Condos) with Rusty prior to the shooting, but denies any knowledge of the shooting.

Franz' 2nd Interview with Detective Mack (9/16@ 3:25 am)

- Rusty and Wofford tell Franz about the shooting. Rusty admitted to Franz he shot Flournoy.
- Franz saw Rusty empty the revolver cylinder onto a bed 3 live rounds and 3 spent casings. Rusty flushed them down a toilet.
- Rusty left the gun inside the master bedroom of the condo. Franz admitted he picked it up with a t-shirt and threw it inside near by bushes.
- Franz later led detectives to the revolver and it was recovered in a bush near the residence.
- .22 cal Smith & Wesson Model 51 Revolver with 3 ½ inch barrel and wood grips.

Eventually, FRANZ stated that when Dylan and Rusty came back to the house, he remembers both Dylan and Rusty saying that they got into a fight. He remembers Dylan stating that they "got in a fight with a nigger." FRANZ said that Dylan told him that he, Dylan, started fighting with a black guy and then Rusty stepped in and shot him. FRANZ remembers Rusty making a comment similar to "yeah, I shot the guy."

Wofford's Second Interview (9/16 @ 1:50 pm)

- Admitted he lied during the first interview
- Said He and Rusty went to the McDonalds and right after they walked out, Rusty became involved in a fight with a black guy.
- During the fight, he heard shots and thought the black guy was shooting at them so he ran back to the Seabridge Condos.
- Never saw Rusty with a gun.
- Rusty ran back to the condo, changed clothes, and left.
- Later in the conversation, he admits he told the owner of the Condo that Rusty shot someone.
- Wofford was **ARRESTED** for suspicion of Murder after the interview.

Both suspects are in custody. Clock Starts!

We have 48 Hours to file charges, or let them go free until we have enough evidence for an arrest warrant.



HUNTINGTON BEACH — A shaved-headed, tattooed teenager who was arrested in the

two Hispanic men in August.

Jonathan Russell Kennedy, 19, appeared in West Orange County Municipal Court in Westminster, where he declined to enter a plea to a murder charge and two counts of attempted murder. His arraignment was continued to Oct. 7.

Deputy District Attorney Jim Tanizaki said prosecutors were filing a petition in juvenile court to try Kennedy's co-defendant, a 17-year-old boy, as an adult.

Police suspect Kennedy shot and killed Vernon Windell Flournoy, 44, outside a McDonald's restaurant on Beach Boulevard on Thursday night. They also suspect him of shooting and wounding Juan Vergara and Angel Campos Silia in Huntington Beach on Aug. 3, police said.

Police Chief Ron Lowenberg said at a news conference Monday that Kennedy has associated in the past with white-supremacist skinheads, but investigators lack conclusive proof that the killing was racially motivated.

"We're not afraid to say it is a hate crime if it is a hate crime, but right now we don't have the evidence." Lowenberg said.

If authorities determine the slaying was racially motivated, Kennedy could face life in prison

AUTOPSY EXAMINATION OF VERNON WINDELL FLOURNOY:

09-16-94, 0900 hours

I attended the pre-autopsy meeting at the Orange County Coro Office. Present were Dr. Joseph HALKA, Huntington Beach Pol Department Criminalist Ruben FLORES, an Orange County Sherif ID technician and myself.

During the external examination of FLOURNOY, I observed a puncture wound in the left side of his chest, a few inches left of the mid-line. I observed a second puncture wound on the upper left portion of his back. I noted that his skin was darker on the knuckle area of both hands and his eyelids. Dr. HALKA incised these areas looking for possible evidence of bruising, with negative results. I did not note any obvious bruises or abrasions on FLOURNOY's body.

Mr. FLOURNOY's body was X-rayed prior to the examination. I noted two objects in the torso area that appeared to be projectiles. During the internal examination, Dr. HALKA removed a .22 caliber bullet from his descending colon. At the time I left the autopsy examination, Dr. HALKA was still attempting to locate the second bullet which had been seen in the X-ray.

Dr. HALKA advised me that his preliminary opinion was that FLOURNOY died as a result of exsanguination due to gunshot wounds that penetrated his heart and lung.

The Coroner removed 2 (.22 cal) bullets.

The Coroners' opinion was that Flournoy died as a result of exsanguination (blood loss) due to gunshot wounds that penetrated his heart and lung.





Teens Plead Not Guilty to Hate Crime Slaying

WESTMINSTER—A high school dropout from Huntington Beach has admitted shooting a black man, but his defense attorney said Thursday the killing was in self-defense and had nothing to do with the man's race.

Attorneys for Jonathan Kennedy, 19, and his co-defendant, Robert Wofford, 17, of Laguna Niguel, also say their clients have been unfairly portrayed by police as white supremacists.

"I think when all the evidence is in, it will show Mr. Kennedy did fire the gun, but it was in self-defense." Deputy Public Defender Sharon Petrosino said. "The evidence will also show this had nothing to with race. Mr. Kennedy is not a skinhead."

Kennedy and Wofford appeared in court Thursday to plead not guilty to murder charges for the death of Vernon W. Flournoy, and an allegation that the victim was targeted because of his race. Flournoy, 44, of Huntington Beach was on his way to

get dinner Sept. 15 when he was gunned down. He was not armed.

Kennedy also pleaded not guilty to two counts of attempted murder and hate crime allegations in the shooting of two Latino men one month earlier. But Petrosino said authorities have the wrong man in the August shootings of Angel Campos Silia and Juan Vergara, both 22

"He was not there, he wasn't even around," said Petrosino, who declined to discuss her client's alibi.

Kennedy was attacked Wednesday by inmates at the Orange County Men's Jail as the door to his single cell opened. Petrosino said it could not be ruled out that the attack was linked to the charges against Kennedy, Kennedy has been moved to a different location. officials said.

Defense attorney Pat McNeal, who represents Wofford, said he is also concerned that labeling his client a "skinhead" could trigger attacks from other inmates. McNeal said his client has previously associated with people who

subscribe to white supremacist beliefs, but his client does not. Wofford is being tried as an adult because of the severity of the charges.

Rhody Kennedy, Kennedy's mother, said he is not a skinhead and that he was beaten up in the dispute with Flournoy. She said police labeled her son a skinhead because he had a shaved head, but she said her son was only trying to get rid of a bad dye job.

his was not racism whatsoever, she said. "This was the wrong people at the wrong place at the wrong time. No one mentions that my son was beaten up too."

McNeal said he wants to see the hate allegations dismissed and the attempted-murder charges reduced to a lesser offense at a Dec. 16 preliminary hearing in Municipal Court in Westminster.

Flournoy's wife, Sharon, declined to discuss the new charges Thursday, But Eugene Wheeler, a spokesman for 100 Black Men of Orange County, commended the Huntington Beach Police Department for its work on the case and the Orange County district attornev's office for filing the toughest charges possible.

"The police did a vigorous and complete investigation and we are very pleased with that," Wheeler said. "We believe a crime like this should get the maximum."

Before hate crime charges were formally filed Thursday, the case had been especially disturbing to minority activists who contend prosecutors are not filing hate crime allegations in all eligible cases and who fear that hate crimes are on the rise in Orange County.

Although they note that the hate crime charge carries a maximum of four years in certain cases, they feel a powerful warning sent by the

After their arraignment Tuesday in Santa Ana, Judge David Carter scheduled both teen-agers to reappear Feb. 24 to have a date set for trial. Wofford is being tried as an adult.

A judge earlier had decided the shooting was racially motivated and both defendants should be tried for the special allegation of committing a hate crime which could add four years to their sentences upon conviction.

Kinsey, an alleged white supremacist also known by the last name Kennedy, is suspected of firing the .22-caliber handgun that killed Flournoy. He also pleaded innocent Tuesday to two counts of attempted murder against two Hispanic men in an unrelated incident.

A petition was filed and the District Attorney filed 71 PC, a misdemeanor. The petition was sustained. When the patrol officers investigated this crime, they found the words "niggers suck" written on clothing items in the car in which WOFFORD and the others were riding. One suspect in this case claimed not to be a gang member, but advocated "white power." WOFFORD maintained that he, too, was not a gang member.

I then found in WOFFORD's probation file two papers each measuring 8 1/2" x 11." Depicted on both of these pages are very intricate drawings showing male "skinheads" involved in fighting and other violent activity. Some characters are shown wearing military boots, armbands with Nazi swastikas, and other Nazi type clothing. One picture is titled, "Anti niggers, spics, gooks, gangs. White supremists (sic) gathering and fuck you if you don't like it." In one corner of one of the pictures were the words, "Done by Dylan." Deputy Probation Officer MARTINEZ allowed me to photocopy these pictures, but wanted the originals to remain in the file. See attached photocopies of these pictures.

WOFFORD and two companions were arrested per a citizen's arrest following an traffic incident in which WOFFORD accused the victim of "flipping him off" and then punching him in the face.

On 01-23-94, Deputy Probation Officer J. PFALMER wrote a probation report in which he stated, "The minor resides with his grandparents and works part-time @ Pic \$ Sav in Huntington Beach.

He is obviously well beyond the control of any adult in his life. He is viewed as a predatory racist individual who presents a serious danger to society. Obviously, formal intervention is in order and some serious consequences must be administered in attempt to stop what is becoming a lengthy pattern of violent criminal behavior."

A petition on WOFFORD was referred to the District Attorney's Office where it was rejected pending further investigation. No further action was taken.

Eventually, FRANZ stated that when Dylan and Rusty came back to the house, he remembers both Dylan and Rusty saying that they got into a fight. In addition, KENNEDY was sentenced to one day in the State Penitentiary.



Orange County Sheriff's Department Case #91-51653 alleged that KENNEDY and three companions, including Dylan HADDOCK, burglarized a residence in Rossmoor in which rifles, shotguns, cash and jewelry was taken. The exact loss estimate was not known.

During the investigation, KENNEDY bragged about being a past member of the "Huntington Beach Death Squad" and the "Crips." He claimed he was the current leader of a gang called "Mafia Disciples." Another minor alleged that KENNEDY bragged about killing someone and often carrying a gun such a sawed off .22 Cal rifle.

12-09-91: A "commitment assessment" of KENNEDY was conducted by an unknown Deputy Probation Officer. (The signature was illegible and current Probation Department personnel did not recognize the signature.)

The officer reported that KENNEDY admitted to being in two "gang related" fights with the past 2 years. KENNEDY claimed to be a member of "Mad Ones," an Italian American" gang, for the past four months. This gang has hostilities with "Weste Trece," "South Side Huntington Beach," "LADS," and "Skinheads." The

After his arrest for the Murder of Flournoy, the District Attorney agreed to charge Rusty with both Murder and the Attempt Murder of Juan Vergara.





Mother Says Son No Skinhead or Racist

■ Suspect: White teen investigated for hate slaying 'has had friends of every race' and harbored no animosity, she says.

HUNTINGTON BEACH—Jonathan Russell Kennedy—the white teen-ager whose alleged slaying of an African American man last week is being investigated as a possible hate crime—was not part of any skinhead group and held no racist views, his mother said in an interview Tuesday.

"Everybody in Huntington Beach . . . they all shave their heads," Rhody Kennedy said.

She said her son, a 19-year-old high school dropout, harbored no racial bias.

"He's had black friends and Mexican friends and Filipino girlfriends," she said. "He's had friends of every race."

Jonathan Kennedy and a 17-yearold youth are charged with murder in the shooting death last week of Vernon Windell Flournoy, 44, outside a McDonald's restaurant in Huntington Beach. Prosecutors said Tuesday they would attempt to try the juvenile as an adult.

Jonathan Kennedy has also been

dropped out of high school and was convicted as a juvenile for taking part in a burglary, Rhody Kennedy said.

Jonathan Kennedy, who has a 2-month-old son living with a girlfriend elsewhere in Huntington Beach, was on his own for more than a year before he moved back in with his mother two weeks ago, Rhody Kennedy said. She said she does not know where in Huntington Beach he lived during that time but said he kept in close touch by phone.

"He always calls and says 'I love you, Mom,' she said, picking a 2-year-old photograph of her son from a cluster of family pictures on the coffee table. "I know I should know more, but he was always doing his own thing," she said.

Man Pleads Guilty to Murder in 1994 Hate Crime Shooting

SANTA ANA—A high school dropout who allegedly embraced white supremacist beliefs pleaded guilty Monday to the 1994 hate-crime shooting death of an African American man in Huntington Beach and another shooting attack on two Latino men.

Jonathan Kinsey. 20, of Huntington Beach entered his plea to murder and other charges just before a jury was to be selected in his trial before Superior Court Judge Robert R. Pitzgerald.

Jury selection will resume today in the trial of co-defendant Robert Wofford, who is also charged with murder in the slaying of Vernon Plournoy, 44, during a confrontation outside a fast-food restaurant.

Deputy Dist. Atty. Jim Tanizaki said Kinsey faces a maximum of 58 years to life in prison when he is sentenced April 26, although the judge can consider his early plea as a factor for a shorter sentence. He was charged with murder and commission of a hate crime in connection with Flournoy's death.

Kinsey's plea did not include any promises for a shorter sentence, the prosecutor said.

Prosecutors allege the September 1994 attack on Flournoy, of Huntington Beach, was racially motivated. Kinsey admitted shooting Flournoy, although he initially contended the killing was in self-defense, according to testimony at his preliminary hearing last year.

A witness told authorities it appeared the two men were blocking the victim's path when angry words were exchanged and a fight broke out. The witness said the two young men were "getting the better" of Flournoy when shots rang out.

An investigator specializing in "skinhead" cases testified that tattoos covering Kinsey's body showed a "personal affirmation to the racist skinhead philosophy."

Wofford, of Laguna Niguel, was 17 at the time of the killing but was ordered to be tried as an adult.

Kinsey also pleaded guilty to charges of attempted murder, assault with a firearm and of committing a hate crime for the August 1994 wounding of two Latino men in Huntington Beach.

An alleged white supremacist pleaded guilty Monday to murder moments before he was to stand trial for shooting a black man to death in 1994 outside a Huntington Beach fast-food restaurant.

The surprise plea means Jonathan Kinsey, 20, now faces a maximum term of 58 years to life in prison. He admitted shooting Vernon Flournoy to death outside a McDonald's restaurant and shooting two Hispanic men a month earlier.

"It's a surprise to me," said Deputy District Attorney Jim Tanizaki. "Maybe he's taking personal responsibility for his actions."

Judge Robert R. Fitzgerald is scheduled to sentence Kinsey on April 26.

Kinsey and Robert Wofford started a fistfight with Flournoy outside the restaurant before Kinsey drew a handgun and began firing, witnesses said. The victim, 44, staggered into the restaurant, then collapsed.

SANTA ANA—A teenager who toted Hitler quotations and a white-supremacist cartoon was convicted Tuesday of murder and a hate crime as the accomplice in the fatal shooting of a black man in Huntington Beach in 1994.

An Orange County Superior Court jury deliberated about 2½ days before finding Robert Dylan Wofford, now 19, guilty of second-degree murder and the added hate crime charge. Wofford, who is white, faces up to 19 years to life in prison.

The verdict unleashed a torrent of emotion among relatives and friends of 44-yearold Vernon Flournoy, a refrigeration technician slain by strangers outside a fast-food restaurant.



HUNTINGTON BEACH - A shaved-headed, tattooed teenager who was arrested in the

slaving of a black man last week - an attack characterized by some as a hate crime - also was charged Monday with shooting two Hispanic men in August.

Jonathan Russell Kennedy, 19, appeared in West Orange County Municipal Court in Westminster, where he declined to enter a plea to a murder charge and two counts of attempted murder. His arraignment was continued to

Deputy District Attorney Jim Tanizaki said prosecutors were

filing a petition in juvenile court to try Kennedy's co-defendant, a 17-year-old boy, as an adult.

Police suspect Kennedy shot and killed Vernon Windell Flournoy, 44, outside a McDonald's restaurant on Beach Boulevard on Thursday night. They also suspect him of shooting and wounding Juan Vergara and Angel Campos Silia in Huntington Beach on Aug. 3, police said.

Police Chief Ron Lowenberg said at a news conference Monday that Kennedy has associated

in the past with white-supremacist skinheads, but investigators lack conclusive proof that the killing was racially motivated.

"We're not afraid to say it is a hate crime if it is a hate crime, but right now we don't have the evidence," Lowenberg said.

If authorities determine the slaving was racially motivated, Kennedy could face life in prison Please see SLAYING Page 2




