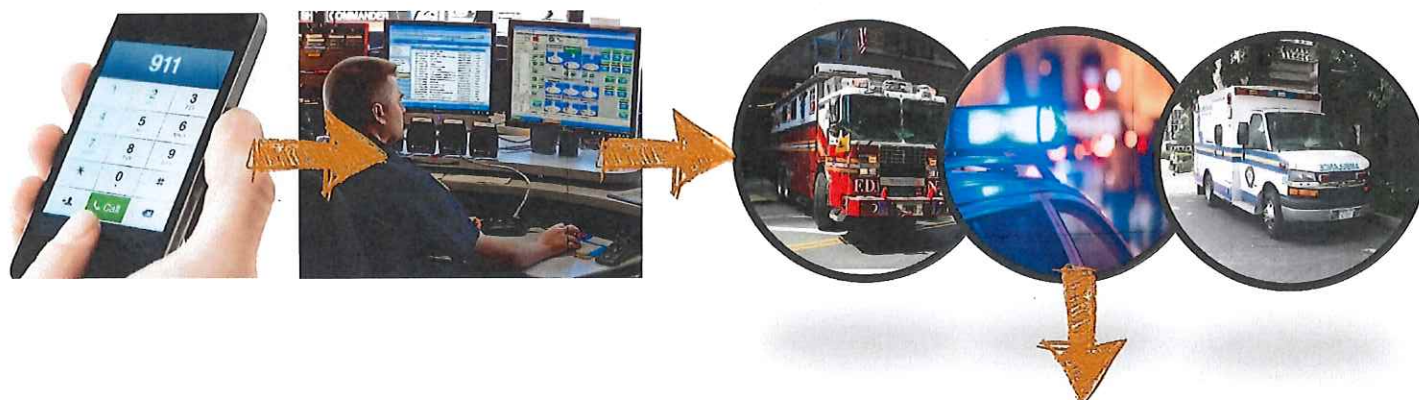

that optimizes deployment of first responders



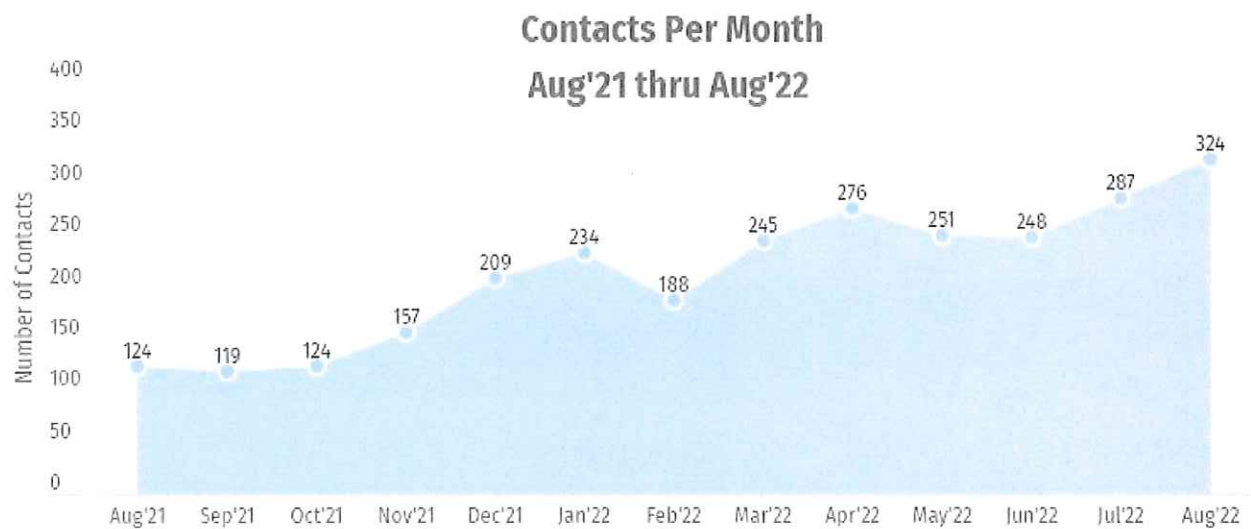


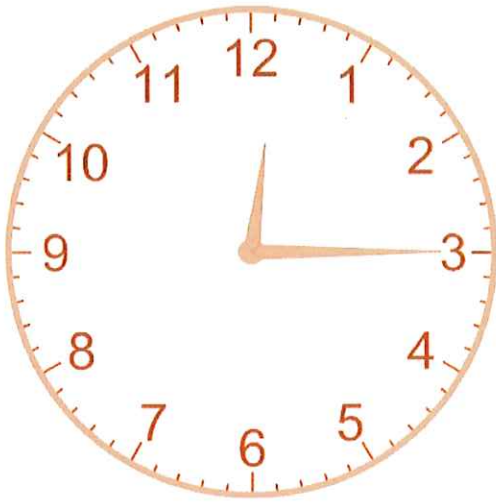
