Ocean View School District supports the option to separate the buffer sites from the Affordable Housing Overlay so that future city council approval of a Zoning Text Amendment will be necessary to add buffer sites. Ocean View School District has previously provided written comment with its concerns that the buffer sites, although not identified as to where they are located, were to be included in the Affordable Housing Overlay. Our concern is that this would make it difficult to understand the impact to school capacity from these developments. The separation of buffer sites from the Affordable Housing Overlay will allow the public to have knowledge of the location and express any concerns in a public hearing when the Zoning Text Amendment is considered by the City Council.
