Oak View Community Facilities

- Oak View Community Center ightarrow
 - 6,487 square feet on City property, comprised of ightarrowportable units for the Family Resource Center office space and a permanent structure for the gymnasium. • Family Resource Center is operated through a non-
 - exclusive license agreement with the Children's Bureau.
- **Oak View Branch Library**
 - 4,182 square feet on Ocean View School District property, comprised of two portable units.
 - Operated through a Ocean View School District Lease Agreement.

Oak View Branch Library Data

SUMMARY FINDINGS

Oak View Branch Library and Community Center

- Two new buildings are proposed. A two story, 24,520 SF building accommodates the new Library and Community Center programming. The second building is a Gymnasium totaling 11,400 SF and includes retractable seating for assembly.
- The Community Center totals 10,125 SF of the total building area and is located on the first floor of the Library/Community Center Building. The Library totals 14,395 SF and is primarily located on the second floor of the building. Library floor area on the first floor totals 1,527 SF and accommodates the street front Library entrance, elevator and stair access to the second floor library and a Circulation Workroom that accommodates Automated Materials Handling System (AMHS) equipment.
- The Community Center has four classrooms; a Tots Classroom for young children's programming and care, a Multi-purpose Classroom for community recreation, dance, aerobics and after school programming, a Nutrition/Wellness Classroom served by an instructional commercial kitchen and a Community Meeting Room, divisible into two meeting rooms that seats 100 people when configured as one room and 50 people when divided.
- The 11,400 SF Gymnasium is at the southeast corner of the project site, at the intersection of Barton Drive and Oak Lane. An additional 4,000 SF of covered outdoor area surrounds the gymnasium. The covered outdoor area opens to the adjoining courtyard and the west promenade that borders the Community Center and Gymnasium buildings.
- Between the two buildings is a 14,400 SF courtyard that faces Oak Lane. The courtyard contains an outdoor basketball court and a Children's Playground that totals 5,900 SF.
- The courtyard is designed for community events and is served by the adjoining Culinary/Wellness commercial kitchen which can provide food service for events.
- 26 parking spaces are provided along Oak Lane. An additional 37 parking spaces are provided on the site of the former Child Care Center west of the proposed Gymnasium in a new tree-shaded surface lot. A total of 63 parking spaces are provided.




BUILDING COURTYARD A courtyard with a basketball court and children's playground faces the Oak Lane alley extension and is between the Gy sium and Library/Community Center building.



- Consolidate city facilities (currently on both City and OVSD property) onto on City property

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





CEQA and Measure C

- **CEQA:** Likely Categorical Exemption
- Huntington Beach Charter Section 612 (Measure C). ightarrow
 - Construction of certain structures in City parks, including the proposed \bigcirc Oak View Concept Plan facilities, first require majority voter approval in a General or Special Election
