- 1. Hate Crimes/Incidents Sgt. Munoz reported.
 - a) There were two hate crimes in March.
 - b) The first crime took place on March 14th at 10am. A father was walking with his daughter, both are of Mexican descent, East of Beach Blvd, near Ellis Ave. A lady in her 50s without provocation yelled, "Get out of my country wetback!" After she yelled, she spit on both of them. The suspect was not caught.
 - c) The second crime took place on March 25th at 4pm. An African American male was walking on Springdale and Warner and the suspect was walking with a large dog on the same sidewalk. The victim said he didn't want the dog near him, and the suspect got upset and yelled, "Nigger!" and kept walking. The suspect then walked back, tied up the dog and assaulted the victim. A police officer happened to be around the corner and the suspect was arrested.

- 1. Cultural Cinema Showcase Rhone and Kaston reporting:

 - Currently,532 films have been submitted for the main event in September. 12 disqualifications. 18 withdrawals. 2 incomplete submissions. Film withdrawals have slowed down. 289 films have been rejected.
- 2. Day of Dialogue Secretary Smith reporting:
 - The DOD took place on April 4th, 2023.
 - 7 high schools attended the event which included 60 students.
 - Council members Burns, Moser, and Mayor Pro Tem Van Der Mark were in attendance.
 - Schoolboard member Dr. Bonnie Castrey gave words of encouragement to the students.
- 3. Community Engagement Member Stuart reporting:
 - Member Stuart provided a July 4th parade update. There was a brief discussion about budgetary concerns and the application fees charged to Boards, Committees, and Commissions.
 - Chair Rhone thanked the Members Keeley, Stuart, and Velazquez for organizing the well-attended Open House.
