# Dear Lyn:

In looking at the Agenda for Monday's City Council meeting (Items 8, 9 & 10), is this really the time to be giving raises? Do we understand the optics? Why now? People are hurting, financially and emotionally.

## Consider the current environment:

- Unemployment applications were reportedly 878,727 last week in California alone (over 6.6 million nationally). [https://www.dol.gov/ui/data.pdf]
- Businesses have shut down all over Huntington Beach, and many may never reopen.
- How are we going to pay the CalPERS hit of several million dollars this year?
- City expenses are up . . . revenues will be down (sales tax (projected \$41.2M), TOT (projected \$14.3M, etc.)). [Approved Budget, p. 2]
- Concessionaires on City-owned property were just given rental abatements because of the shutdowns and unknown short- and long-term effects of COVID-19.
- Private sector employees are being laid off, or are taking pay cuts rather than lose their jobs (as my son had to do).
- The value of the City's asset portfolio has plunged along with the stock market.
- The previously Council-approved "Adopted Budget Fiscal Year 2019-2020" showing projected Revenues of \$372,464,890, can no longer be viable. [Adopted Budget, p. 17]

In my view, fiscal responsibility (and your fiduciary obligation to be a good steward of taxpayers' monies) demands that wages — and negotiations for salary increases — should be frozen until a clearer picture of the fiscal impact of COVID-19 on our City is brought into

focus, analyzed and explained. And that likely will take a year or so — and in the interim, we can figure out how to pay the expected CalPERS invoices.

Is this really the time to be giving raises?

## Councilmembers,

I am the CEO of a privately held software company. I employ 17 people full time, and have for the past 22 years. My business survived the .COM meltdown, 9-11, and the 2009 financial crisis. During those times we had to lean our staff, freeze pay and really buckle down to make sure we could survive, but we did.

What the business faces today is the WORSE I've ever seen, far worse than 9-11 and the financial crisis. Literally ALL new business has halted, 100% due to the uncertainty of the future. We are hopeful that we can receive some of the 8 week CARES funds, but that's still up in the air. I personally have to face going into debt for tens of thousands of dollars every single month in order to keep the staff at the size we are today, or lay them off. Unfortunately I am not independently wealthy and have two teen kids and a family to consider.... These are VERY difficult times.

I grew up in HB, went to HBHS and then the University of Michigan before coming back to the city in 1999. I find it APPUALLING for HB to even be considering any sort of pay expansion in the faces of those of us who may be ruined financially by the situation today. Please be respectful of those of us who are facing the most gut wrenching decisions of our lives today, and freeze all pay until the pandemic has passed and we have recovered economically.
