# Amendment #2 to 2019-20 Annual Action Plan - SUBSTANTIAL

- Per Citizen Participation Plan, substantial amendment needs Council approval when **new program** or **increase in funding** (over 25% of annual allocation)
- Huntington Beach received an additional \$727,819 in CDBG funding in response to COVID-19 as part of CARES Act





# Amendment to 2019-20 Annual Action Plan

- Cancellation of 2018 Navigation Center Project—15311 Pipeline Lane (\$989,000)
- Cancellation of 2019 Section 108 Loan Repayment activity (\$220,536)
- Addition of Cameron Lane Navigation Center Operations (\$1.5M)
  - \$772,181 - CDBG Program Income
  - \$727,819 - CARES Act
- Increase Children's Bureau funding (\$25,000)



# Amendment to 2019-20 Annual Action Plan Cont.

- Increase City's Senior Services Care Management Program (\$15,000)
- Close out City's Revolving Loan Fund Program
- Cancellation of 15161 Jackson Street Navigation Center (\$667,808 HOME funds)
- Increase in HOME Administration budget (\$234,569)
- Addendum to Tenant Based Rental Assistance Program (Operating Guidelines)



# 2015-19 Citizen Participation Plan Amendment

- Consolidated Plan requires that City adopt Citizen Participation Plan to ensure compliance pertaining use of federal funds from HUD including planning, application, citizen participation, and reporting processes
- Due to COVID-19, HUD has made available temporary guidelines for citizen participation



# 2015-19 Citizen Participation Plan Amendment

- As of April 24, 2020, temporary waived HUD guideline for public comment period and shortened to 5-days (typically 30)
- Amendment outlines steps City will take during pandemic
- Temporary guidelines will apply to CDBG and HOME funding for FY 2019/20 and FY 2020/21, as well as CARES Act Funds
