The council has the grave responsibility of managing a citywide response to the recent oil spill affecting our single most important natural resource. The ecological impacts are acute and pressing, and managing the economic impact is likely to claim the lion's share of the council's attention and working efforts over the next few months. While the impact to the city and our reputation as a healthy venue for outdoor activities organized at the water's edge is unknown, those water's edge activities underly the value of every piece of real estate in the city, both commercial and residential. Even during a global pandemic, those activities remained in place and were the reason that we and our neighbors would come to our parking lots, enjoy meals in our restaurants, book stays in our hotels.
