#### Local Ballot Measures

Stats on the ballot measures that the IRC are following:

Proposition 15 – studies are showing 49% of voters in support, and 21% of voters oppose, while 30% are undecided. So far \$106million dollars have been spent on this proposition, \$52million on the FOR side, and \$54million on the OPPOSE.

Proposition 22 – Studies are showing 45% of voters support, 31% of voters oppose, and 20% are undecided. \$205million has been spent, with the vast majority being spent in support of at \$189million, and \$15million in opposition.

City Sponsored Legislation

A new two-year legislative cycle kicks off in January, so now is the time to start thinking about if the City would like to sponsor any legislation.

**FEDERAL ITEMS**

Laura Kroeger from Townsend's Washington DC office reported on Federal items:

1. Phase 4 Funding: Negotiations are ongoing, with Mnuchin and Pelosi getting closer to an agreement than they have been in the last 4 months. Pelosi is trying to push for an agreement before November 1, which is possible but not likely. The issue of state and local funding is still far apart in the negotiations. There is legislation with the House that will provide \$500 billion to local governments, and House Speaker Pelosi has stated that the House will not recess until a package has been approved.
2. Jet Noise: The FAA has been in talks to get a glide slope change and is looking to fast track the approval. Rouda's office has made themselves available if necessary, but she believes they are close to a resolution.
