## **MEETING MINUTES**

Wednesday, September 8, 2021 6:00 PM – Regular Meeting

## **CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order at 6:04 PM.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Mark Sheldon mentioned the following topics:

- sea level rise and development along the coast
- presentation by Public Works Director (Mobility Plan in Huntington Beach)
- global cleanup day
- art contest
- Ascon
- street closures in downtown

#### **CONSENT CALENDAR**

1. Approval of Minutes – August 11, 2021 Meeting Minutes Moved by Benneman and seconded by Soriano. Motion carried 5-0.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

- 1. Environmental Review Items
  - Soriano asked about the status of the Sustainability Master Plan.
  - Moser said that staff is developing the Plan.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

- 1. Executive Committee (Soriano, Benneman)
  - Benneman suggested starting a Bylaws Committee to review the Board's bylaws. Perhaps establishing an Ad Hoc Committee with Mark Sheldon. Agenda Item for next meeting.

# 2. Education and Outreach (Benneman, Fockler)

- a. Art Contest
  - Fockler discussed the Art Contest To-Do List and process.
  - March 2022 timeline
  - Art Contest Committee: Fockler, Benneman, Soriano
  - Email flyers to teachers and post printed flyers at school to get the word out about the art contest
  - Accept paper and digital media art pieces

# 3. Natural Resource Management and Open Space (McGowan, Siegal)

- a. Jeff Henderson Extreme Heat and Urban Heat Islands
  - Speaker was concerned with meeting location and would like to participate at a later date.
  - McGowan said that Huntington Beach does not have a problem but cities further inland have more intense heat index.
  - Soriano mentioned the City of Los Angeles study on this issue.
  - Siegal expressed concern about urban heat islands as they related to water usage.

#### b. Park and Open Space Mapping

- McGowan reported on Huntington Beach ranking parkland areas for density of population.
- Benneman said residential density is increasing.
- Fockler questioned how Huntington Beach gets to count the beach in the parkland requirement.
- Siegal suggested looking at the data and reviewing how they are calculated.
- Soriano asked about the Ascon and Magnolia Tank Farm developments and designation of open space.
- Moser recorded questions and concerns from the Board to take back to the City Council.

# 4. Green Economy (Fockler, Siegal, Soriano)

- a. Sustainable Business Certificate Program
  - Discussion of how the Environmental Board could facilitate the continuation of the Green Business Certification Program in Huntington Beach through an internship at Goldenwest College.
  - Benneman to sit down with Department Chair to discuss the possibility of this internship program or independent study class.
  - Siegal suggested having a process/procedure for student involvement with supervision from a professor.
  - McGowan suggested having questions and checklists for field inspection to maintain the statewide standards.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS**

- 1. Environmental Board Officers (Appointment and Term)
  - Extend the current term of officers to June 30, 2022
  - Moved by Benneman and seconded by Fockler. Motion carried 5-0.

Soriano as Chair Benneman as Vice-Chair Fockler as Secretary (Siegal when Fockler not available)

- 2. New Meeting Date
  - second Wednesday of the month
- 3. Orange County Power Authority Community Advisory Committee Report
  - McGowan reported about the Advisory Committee (purpose, staff members, Board members, implementation in Spring 2022 for commercial customers, OCPower.org)
  - Concerns include: competitiveness, renewal energy, isolated grid, control by city

#### **MEMBER COMMENTS**

1. Moser – Direct staff to create a call out on social media for recruitment of four vacant positions with a 2-week deadline to submit applications.
