The team made a presentation on draft Community Engagement Plan, data collection and conditions assessment, and project schedule. The Board

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provided comments to include Golden West College, other regional agencies such as OCSAN, Orange County Public Works/Flood Control District, and area universities such as Cal State Long Beach and UCI for community engagement. The Board suggested altering language in the Sampling Plan to more positively identify renter-residents, who may typically not be solicited for or provide input.

The Board also engaged in discussion identifying priority to include in the Plan: Water conservation, landscaping, waste reduction, composting, microdigesters, active transportation, EV charging, messaging and wording choice, and communication with the public. The Board discussed policy based on evidence backed decisions and utilizing public-private partnerships to sponsor and help create projects.

Staff will update the timeline and send to the Board.

F. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Benneman requested to discuss the safety of electric bikes and active transit. McGowan notified the Board that her community member seat for OCPA is available.
